HSE Residential – 16th & 17th March

Rosalyn and Yvonne gave feedback from the HSE Residential Meeting that took place last weekend in London. On the Friday board members discussed the implications / possible model of a proposed partnership with Relational Schools. On the Saturday Rob Loe of Relational Schools gave a talk about the organisation and where they are now. He said that he had used academic documents from HSE's website when he was studying for his PhD and Relational Schools is very much based on the philosophy of HSE. In his work he uses a tool to measure relationships within schools and his work has attracted a large amount of funding, interest from members of parliament, and positive links with the XP School in Doncaster. He felt that combining with HSE would give a greater voice to our shared beliefs. Rob Loe answered questions put by board members, and then we unanimously agreed that amalgamation would be a very positive step forward. It was agreed to have a further meeting on 18th April at Sir William Burrough Primary School in Limehouse, London, when we will put together a Partnership Agreement. Rosalyn & Yvonne both plan to attend this meeting.

Members of our Steering Group had a brief discussion in relation to this proposal. Again, all members thought it was a positive move. Bob said she knew Andrew Jackson of XP School and thought not only would it be worthwhile for Steering Group members to pay the school a visit but it would also be somewhere BGU could use for student placements. Bob is going to make contact with Andrew Jackson.
